Definition


Kleptomania is the inability to resist impulses to steal. The things that are stolen are not needed for personal use. They are also not taken for their monetary value. This is a rare condition.

Causes

The exact cause of kleptomania is unknown. It of ten occurs with other psychological disorders. These include:

- <u>Depression</u>
- <u>Anxiety</u>
- Substanceabuse(eg, <u>alcoholism</u>, <u>drugabuse</u>)
- Eatingdisorders(eg, <u>anorexia</u>, <u>bulimia</u>)
- Otherimpulsecontroldisorders

RiskFactors

Kleptomania appears to be more common infemales than in males. There are no other known risk factors.

Symptoms

Symptomsofkleptomaniaincludeallofthefollowing:

- Arepeatedinabilitytoresistimpulsestostealthingsthatarenotofpersonalvalue
- Afeelingofrelief, gratification, and/orpleasurewhenstealingthings
- Theftsnotcommittedoutofangerorvengeance
- $\bullet \ Lack of a better explanation for the the ft, such as another psychological disorder$

Diagnosis

Kleptomania is different from shop lifting or ordinary the ft, which is:

- Deliberate
- Motivatedbythestolenitem'susefulnessormonetaryvalue
- Theresultofadare, an actof rebellion, or arite of passage

Medications

Drugsusedfortreatmentinclude:

- Selectiveserotoninreuptakeinhibitors(SSRIs)—raiseserotoninlevelsinthebrain, such as <u>fluoxetine(eg, Prozac), fluvoxamine(eg, Luvox)</u>, <u>paroxetine(eg, Paxil)</u>, <u>sertraline(eg, Zoloft)</u>
- <u>Lithium</u>—balancesthemoodswingstopreventrapidshiftsthatmaycausetheurgetosteal(eg,Eskalith)
- <u>Trazodone(eg,Desyrel,Trialodine)</u>
- <u>Valproicacid (eg</u>,Depakene,Valproate,Valrelease)
